IIM Shillong Admission Eligibility Criteria

It is essential to check the IIM S Eligibility Details before proceeding so as to avoid last-minute disqualification. Check all the details concerning IIM Shillong Admission Eligibility Criteria below

 Candidates applying for admissions at IIM-S must possess a bachelor's degree with 50% marks (or equivalent CGPA, relaxed to 45% marks/CGPA for SC/ST/DA^ category students) ^DA here refers to Differently Abled and is used against the term Person with Disability (PwD)



- The bachelor's degree or equivalent must be a minimum 3-year course completed after his/her 12th standard at school
- In case the candidate is awarded grades/CGPA instead of marks, the same should be converted to percentage as per the university's norms. However, if there is no such mention of any norm by the institute/university, the equivalence would be made by dividing the obtained CGPA by the maximum obtainable CGPA and multiplying the result by 100
- Candidates who are in their final year of graduation can also apply for admission to IIM-S by taking the CAT exam (usually happens in the last week of November every year)

IIM Shillong Admission Process for PGP 2021-23 Batch

Understand the Admission Process for PGP 2021-23 Batch in IIM S.

First of all, candidates seeking admissions need to fill the CAT form (however, international students must fill the GMAT form and get admissions through GMAT score in place of CAT) in which they need to select all the programmes of IIM-S in which they are interested

- Indian candidates have to then appear for the CAT examination (which usually happens in late November every year)
- There is a specific cut-off score/percentile set by the IIM-S for every CAT based programme and the students need to score at par or above that in order to get themselves screened-in for the subsequent rounds

The admission in IIM-S happens in 2 phases.

The details about all three of them is given below

IIM S Admission Process Phase 1 (Shortlisting for GD and PI)

A minimum eligibility criteria is applied to all the candidates who have opted for IIM-S to get them one step closer to the GD & PI rounds. The eligibility criteria table is given below:

^{*}The eligibility criteria mentioned is for IIM-S PGP 2020-22 batch. This criteria might change for upcoming batches.

Only those candidates who satisfy the criteria mentioned in the above table will be considered for taking to further filtration process in which the candidates are further filtered depending upon their:

- Discipline of bachelor's degree
- Category to which a candidate belongs

Following weightage (reservation) is given to the filtered candidates:

- Candidates belonging to OTHERS category 67.5% rounded to higher nearest integer
- Candidates belonging to EWS category 10% rounded to higher nearest integer
- Candidates belonging to SC category 15% rounded to higher nearest integer
- Candidates belonging to ST category 7.5% rounded to higher nearest integer

IIM S Admission Process Phase 2 (Merit List Creation for Final Admission Offer) In this phase of the admission process, after the candidates have gone through the GD and PI rounds, a final merit list is prepared for the students who have successfully been able to get admission to the IIM-S. the final calculation of the scores is done on the basis of the following three factors:

- Overall CAT Absolute Score (30% weightage),
- GD Score (20% weightage), and
- PI Score (50% weightage)
- The cut-off percentage for different category candidates for GD and PI rounds are given below:

As far as international students are concerned, they need to appear for the GMAT in place of CAT, rest all the procedure remains mostly similar to that of the Indian Students.

- A total of 60 companies visited IIM-S for placements in 2020
- The average domestic package offered to the candidates in 2020 was 18.76 LPA
- The highest domestic package offered to a student in 2020 was 48.50 LPA
- The average domestic package (top 20% offers) to the candidates in 2020 was 29.17 LPA and average domestic package (top 50% offers) to the candidates in 2020 was Rs. 23.38 LPA
