History of January 22

- ♦ 1760: The British defeated the French at the Battle of Wandiwash.

Current Affairs Related to 22 January

- The 9th Asian Winter Games, set to light up the winter sports landscape in 2025, has officially entered an exciting phase with the unveiling of its main symbols, slogan, emblem and mascot. The grand spectacle, held in the capital of China's Heilongjiang province, is a significant achievement as the Games approach.
- China has sent an unprecedented astronomical satellite called Einstein Probe into space on a mission to observe mysterious transient phenomena in the universe. The lotus-shaped satellite uses innovative X-ray detection technology inspired by the functioning of the lobster eye. The mission, launched from the Xichang Satellite Launch Center in southwest China's Sichuan province, is an important step in unraveling the mysteries of the universe.
- World Health Organization launches International Classification of Diseases Traditional Medicine Module 2. This module covers data and terminology related to diseases based on Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani medicine. Apart from this, the terminology defining diseases has been indexed in the form of a code. These codes can also be used to create future strategies to control various diseases in the society.
- ↑ The Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code came into force in the year 2016 to achieve multiple objectives, including maximizing the value of the debtor's assets, promoting entrepreneurship, ensuring timely resolution of cases and balancing the interests of stakeholders.
- ♦ World Health Organization launches International Classification of Diseases Traditional Medicine Module 2. This module covers data and terminology related to diseases based on Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani medicine. Apart from this, the terminology defining diseases has been indexed in the form of a code.

- America and Britain have taken major action against Houthi rebels targeting merchant ships in the Red Sea. In fact, the armies of both the countries have carried out air strikes on the positions of Houthi rebels at many places in Yemen. Houthi rebels have suffered huge losses in these air strikes and many of their hideouts have been destroyed. Tension may further increase in West Asia after America and Britain's attack.
- The World Bank has revealed surprising resilience in the global economy, although a shadow looms over the future, with recession expected for the third consecutive year in 2024. After a strong rebound of 6.2% in 2021, global growth slowed to 3.0% in 2022 and 2.6% in 2023. Projections show a sustained decline to 2.4% in 2024, before a modest recovery to 2.7% in 2025, well below the 2010 average of 3.1%.
- Former Director General of Central Industrial Security Force Sheel Vardhan Singh has been appointed as member of the Union Public Service Commission. The decision was communicated through a Ministry of Personnel order, marking a notable achievement in Singh's distinguished career. UPSC, headed by a Chairman, is responsible for conducting the Civil Services Examination, a rigorous process that selects individuals for key administrative and leadership roles in the country. The Commission can have a maximum of 10 members, each appointed for a term of six years or until they attain the age of 65 years.
- Saffron fields in Kashmir, famous for the production of the world's most expensive spice, are facing serious crisis due to encroachment of cement factories. Despite being the world's second largest saffron producer after Iran, with an average annual production of 11.12 tonnes, the region's saffron business is declining, causing economic problems for local farmers.


- 6. Where has the world record for installation of the longest solar light line been made recently?


