History of December 6

- ♦ 1907: The first incident of robbery related to India's freedom struggle took place at Chingripota railway station.
- ♦ 1956: Bhimrao Ambedkar, a Bahujan political leader, died.
- 1992: The controversial structure of Babri Masjid located in Ayodhya, India was demolished.

Current Affairs Related to 6 December

- Adani Power Ltd will use green ammonia along with coal to run a 330 MW boiler at its plant in Mundra, Gujarat. The company said in a statement that the amount of green ammonia will be up to 20 percent of the total fuel requirement. This will help in reducing carbon emissions. This innovative approach aims to achieve a 20% blending of green ammonia with the total fuel requirement for the boiler.
- ♦ The Rural Marketing Association of India, the leading organization for rural marketers, announced major leadership changes during its 18th Annual General Meeting. Puneet Vidyarthi has been appointed as the Chairman for the period 2023-2025, replacing Vishwabaran Chakraborty.
- ↑ The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi has approved the Pradhan Mantri Tribal Justice Maha Abhiyan with a total outlay of Rs 24,104 crore. Out of the total Rs 24,104 crore, the Centre's share will be Rs 15,336 crore and the state's share will be Rs 8,768 crore. Under this, 11 important areas will be focused through the concerned ministries. Pradhan Mantri PVTG Vikas Mission will be launched to improve the socio-economic conditions of particularly vulnerable tribal groups.
- An MoU has been signed to promote innovation, investment and technological exchange between North Rhine-Westphalia in Germany and India. The state-owned foreign trade promotion agency NRW Global Business is the partner for all companies planning investment projects and settling in North Rhine-Westphalia. It also serves the development of foreign markets for North Rhine-Westphalian companies and networking with international business partners.
- Somali refugee Abdullahi Maarey has been named the 2023 UNHCR Nansen Refugee Prize Global Laureate for his work advocating the right to education for displaced children.

- The government extended the free ration scheme by 5 years. Now this benefit will be available till 2028. Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana is being run by the Central Government for distribution of free food grains to the poor. This scheme has been started to help the poor at the time of Corona epidemic. According to a recent report, the number of beneficiaries of this scheme is more than 80 crores. Most of these beneficiaries are from Uttar Pradesh.
- The Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board, one of the US government's main retirement funds with more than \$600 billion in assets, has decided to change the indices it uses to invest in global equities. It will now use the MSCI ACWI IMI ex USA, ex China ex Hong Kong index instead of the MSCI EAFE index.
- Union Coal and Mines Minister Prahlad Joshi started the auction process of critical minerals for the first time. Twenty blocks of critical and strategic minerals spread over different parts of the country will be auctioned. It will also help boost India's economy, enhance national security and transition to a clean energy future. The auction will be conducted online in two phases. Royalty rates of critical minerals have been rationalized to encourage greater participation in these auctions.
- ↑ The US Embassy and its Consulates issued a record 1.40 lakh visas to Indian students between October 2022 and September 2023. During this period the US State Department issued 10 million non-immigrant visas globally. The US State Department said it has issued about 8 million visitor visas for business and tourism purposes.
- ♦ The Indian Space Research Organization's Astrosat has detected more than 600 gamma ray bursts since it became operational in 2015.
