History of 22 April

- ♦ 1970 : Earth Day was celebrated for the first time in the world.

Current Affairs Related to 22 April 2024

- ♦ ISRO Chairman S Somanath announced that the country aims to achieve a debris-free space mission by 2030. ISRO has a set plan for space exploration. The main objective of this initiative is to achieve a debris-free space mission by 2030. As part of its zero orbit debris mission, ISRO had brought back several old satellites and fourth stage PSLV rockets to earth through the deorbiting process. India is planning to set up its own space station Indian Space Station by 2035.
- ♦ In the field of environmental protection, an effective environment protection campaign has been launched in Madhya Pradesh at the heart of the Green Credit Program by the government. In the last two months, GCP has launched greening records in 500 land plots covering an area of 4980 hectares in 10 states. Madhya Pradesh has taken the lead in getting clearances for delineation of forest wastelands, followed by Telangana, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat and Assam.
- RBI has banned the Bank of Baroda World app. Strict measures have reportedly been proposed by the Finance Ministry to protect citizens from cyber frauds. These measures have been taken following a spurt in incidents including the recent Bank of Baroda World App scam. These measures are considered to be part of a broader national effort to combat cyber crime. To deal with this growing threat, the Ministry of Home Affairs established the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre.
- ↑ The World Economic Forum has named Nykaa's Advait Nair as the 2024 Young Global Leader. Nykaa co-founder and CEO Advait Nair has been inducted into the Young Global Leaders Community of the World Economic Forum. Nair joined a group of 90 individuals from around the world for her work as a change maker and entrepreneur. She is one of the most powerful political and business leaders in the world.

- Associates Life Insurance Company, one of the most private life insurance company in the country, launched the first edition of IdeasXx. This is a pioneering initiative that can revolutionize the future of the insurance sector. The objective of this innovative platform is to sensitize future leaders of B-schools across the country about unconventional life insurance solutions.
- The government has shortlisted IIT officer Saurabh Garg for additional powers of the ministry's secretary. The decision was communicated by issuing an order by the Department of Vocational and Training reflecting Garg's vast experience and expertise in the field of public administration. Garg, a 1991-batch Indian National Service officer of Odisha cadre, will serve in this capacity till he is appointed regularly or further instructions are issued.
- A state-of-the-art submersible platform for underwater characterization and evaluation has been inaugurated in Kerala. A state-of-the-art submersible platform for characterization and evaluation is a major test and evaluation centre for sonar systems for the Indian Navy, established by DRDO. It will be used for survey sampling and data collection of air, surface, midwater and reservoir floor parameters.
- From developing sugarcane hybrids by botanist Janaki Ammal in the 1930s to Tessy Thomas who led the first test launch of the Agni-IV missile in 2011, Indian women have an impressive presence in the field of science. However, according to a study by ByswatchIndia, only 13.5 per cent of STEM faculty members in 98 universities and institutions in the country are women.
- ♦ The UAE has received the highest rainfall on record, which is more than all the data collected since 1949. In the last 24 hours, many areas of the United Arab Emirates received rain.
