History of 27th March

- ♦ 2008: The space shuttle Endeavor successfully returned to Earth safely.
- ♦ 2003 : Russia tested the deadly Topol RS-12 ballistic missile.
- ♦ 1936 : Indian politician Banwari Lal Joshi was born.
- ◆ 1915 : The prominent leader of Gadar Party, Pandit Kanshi Ram died.
- ♦ 1668: The ruler of England, Charles II, handed over Bombay to the East India Company.

Current Affairs Related to 27th March

- A study has shown that India's solar waste could reach 600 kilotons by 2030, equivalent to filling 720 Olympic-sized swimming pools. The study was released by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy and independent think tank Council on Energy, Environment and Water.
- This agreement between the United States, United Kingdom and Australia marks an important milestone in the defense cooperation effort. Australia's AAC and UK-based BAE Systems will build SSN Acus submarines for the Royal Australian Navy under a new trilateral defense partnership. These submarines will be capable of undertaking intelligence surveillance, underwater warfare and strike missions. This will provide maximum interoperability among AUKUS partners.
- The first resolution on Artificial Intelligence was approved by the United Nations General Assembly. The resolution lends global support to the international effort to ensure that powerful new technologies benefit all countries, and respect human rights. The resolution was adopted unanimously without a vote, sponsored by the United States and co-sponsored by 123 countries. This means that the proposal has the support of all 193 member states of the United Nations.
- An agreement was signed between NCC and NPCIL to raise awareness about peaceful uses of nuclear energy. National Cadet Corps and Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited joined hands to conduct awareness programs across the country. This will disseminate scientific information about the peaceful uses of nuclear energy. The MoU will provide a unique opportunity to the cadets to visit various facilities of NPCIL, thereby gaining first-hand experience on the peaceful uses of nuclear energy and its technical and technological aspects.
- ♦ India has decided to double the assistance to Bhutan from Rs 5,000 crore in 2019-2024 to Rs 10,000

- crore by 2029. India and Bhutan signed seven agreements on cooperation in energy, food, security, sports, space and research. India and Bhutan will work on initiatives for improved air connectivity and rail connectivity between Kokrajhar Gelephu and Banharhat Samtse and waterway navigation through the Brahmaputra. Financial assistance also includes India's support for Bhutan's economic stimulus package.
- The Bureau of Financial Services has elected Bhupesh Sushil Rahul as the Chairman and Managing Director of United India Insurance Company. Neerja Kapoor's tenure at New India Insurance will end in April 2024. Girija Subramaniam is currently serving as the CMD of Agricultural Insurance Company of India. B S Rahul is the General Manager of Indian Agricultural Insurance Company. Six general managers were shortlisted for the CMD post.
- India's Telecom Secretary Neeraj Mital has been unanimously elected as the co-chairman of the International Telecommunication Union's Digital Innovation Board. ITU's Digital Innovation Board has been formed under the auspices of the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Alliance for Digital Development. The United Nations has launched the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Coalition for Digital Development to meet the needs of ITU members in the field of innovation.
- Sripriya Ranganathan, Deputy Ambassador at the Indian Embassy in the US, received the award on behalf of ISRO. The Aviation Week Laureates Awards are known for recognizing exceptional achievements within the aerospace industry. At a modest cost of \$75 million, this mission achieved a historic feat by successfully landing on the south pole of the Moon.
- ♦ Bhutan's highest civilian award, the Order of the Druk Gyalpo, will be presented to Prime Minister Narendra Modi by Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck.
