History of 23rd July

- ♦ 1555 : Sikandar Suri defeated Mughal ruler Humayun at Sirhind and entered Delhi.
- ♦ 1881: The International Gymnastic Federation established the sports federation. This is the oldest sports organization in the world.
- ♦ 1856 : Mathematician, theist and militant nationalist Bal Gangadhar Tilak was born.
- ♦ 1927: Regular radio broadcasting in India started from Mumbai.
- ♦ 1903 : Ford Motor Company launched its first car.

Current Affairs Related to 23rd July 2024

- Union Ministry of Education and UGC launched Asmita Project to produce 22,000 books in Indian languages over the next five years. Asmita Project was launched by Higher Education Secretary Sanjay Murthy. This is one of the many initiatives taken by the government to promote Indian languages ??in the education system. The project aims to produce 1,000 books in 22 languages within five years. Under this initiative, 1800 textbooks covering Arts, Science and Commerce streams will be prepared by June 2025.
- Government launches India's first toll-free national anti-narcotics helpline number. The government has started helpline 1933 which is also known as MANAS. Union Home Minister Amit Shah launched it during the seventh top-level meeting of the Narco Coordination Centre. With this, people will be able to inform the Narcotics Control Bureau about illegal drug trade and related issues. The helpline named Manas aims to establish a user-friendly platform for every citizen, where they can easily report drug related cases 24x7.
- According to the scientific survey report of the Archaeological Survey of India, the existing structure in the Bhojshala complex in Dhar districts of Madhya Pradesh was constructed using the remains of the temple. As per the instructions of the High Court, ASI has conducted a scientific survey of the Bhojshala Temple Kamal Maula Masjid complex. ASI has submitted its report to the Indore bench of Madhya Pradesh High Court.
- The government has amended the structure of NITI Aayog. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will remain the chairman of NITI Aayog. Suman Berry will continue on the post of Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog. There has been no change in the full-time members. The full-time members include VK Saraswat, Prof. Ramesh Chand, Dr. VK Paul and Anand Viryani.
- ◆ India and Switzerland have set a target of \$100 billion investment and 1 million jobs in the next 15 years.

- Uttar Pradesh government will increase the income of farmers through carbon finance. With this, farmers will be encouraged to participate in the tree plantation campaign. Uttar Pradesh government planted 36.50 crore saplings. The UP government has set a target of achieving net zero carbon emissions by 2070. Farmers will get additional income from carbon credits by planting fast growing trees like Chinar, Melia, Dubia and Semal.
- The International Monetary Fund, in its latest fore-cast, has increased India's growth projections for 2024 to 7% from the earlier 6.8%. This will ensure that India remains the fastest growing country among emerging markets and developing economies. IMF has estimated India's growth rate to be 6.5% for the year 2025. It attributed the growth forecast to strong and robust domestic demand and a growing working population. India and China's growth will account for almost half of global growth in 2024.
- Asia's first health research related pre-clinical network facility was inaugurated under CEPI. It was inaugurated at the Regional Center for Biotechnology under the aegis of Translational Health Science and Technologies Institute, Faridabad. The Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations has selected BRIC THSTI as a pre-clinical network laboratory based on its capacity to handle BSL3 pathogens.
- E-mobility R&D roadmap for India has been released by the government. It is a comprehensive roadmap that aims to establish India as a world leader in electric vehicle technology. The roadmap was launched by Professor Ajay Kumar Sood, Principal Scientific Advisor to the Government of India, at Vigyan Bhawan Annexe in New Delhi. Energy storage cells, EV assemblies, materials and recycling and charging and refueling are the four main focus areas of the roadmap.






