## History of 26th March

- ♦ 1552 : Guru Amardas became the third Guru of the Sikhs.
- ♦ 1668 : England captured Bombay.
- ◆ 1972: The fourth President of India, V.V. Giri inaugurated the International Sanskrit Conference.
- 1973: Farmers in the hill states of India protesting against deforestation had put forward a proposal to protect the environment, which was called the Visibility Movement.
- ♦ 2006 : Indian saint Anil Biswas passed away.

## Current Affairs Related to 26th March

- Environment Ministry made new rules on biodegradable plastics. The new rules will make it harder for disposable plastic manufacturers to label products as biodegradable. It defines biodegradable plastics as capable of being degraded through biological processes in specific environments such as soil and landfills. The new rule does not specify which chemical tests can be used to detect the presence of microplastics in biodegradable plastics.
- ♦ New Zealand said it would ban disposable e-cigarettes or vapes and increase financial penalties for those selling such products to minors. The move comes less than a month after the government repealed a unique law to phase out tobacco smoking by imposing a lifetime ban on youth buying cigarettes. This unique law was made by the previous leftist government. Under the new laws the government will impose fines of up to NZ\$1,000,000 on retailers selling vapes to children under the age of 18.
- A new Indian-made tank engine was tested for the first time in Mysuru. The Defense Ministry said this demonstrates the country's technological prowess and commitment towards self-reliance in defense technologies. The 1500 HP engine represents a paradigm shift in military propulsion systems with state-of-the-art features. The project was launched in August 2020 and is expected to be completed by mid-2025. This engine will power the Arjun MK-1A tank.
- Counseling Markets, a major player in the insurance and financial services, has revealed plans to individualise its shares by setting up a wholly owned subsidiary called PB Pay Pvt Ltd. The goal of this subsidiary is to gain expertise in domestic and international payments integration company approved by the Board of Directors.

- ♦ Bhutan's highest civilian award, the Order of the Duk Gyalpo, will be presented to Prime Minister Narendra Modi by Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck. Bhutan's highest civilian award in 2021 was announced in recognition of PM Modi's efforts towards strengthening India-Bhutan ties, especially India's effort to provide 5,000,000 doses of COVID-19 vaccines.
- The Indian Space Research Organization has achieved a significant milestone with the success of India's first relaunched vehicle Pushpak with the launch objective of RLV-Lex 02 at Chitradurga. This achievement is a symbol of ISRO's success in space and technology.
- Neeraj Mishti organized naming meetings at the International Legal Association Headquarters to appoint Dr. Neeraj Mishti, Secretary, Legal Department of India, to lead an important institution in Geneva. Its objective was to include cooperation and innovative initiatives in logistics and information and communication technology. The Digital Innovation Board is comprised of scientists/scientific ministers and deputy ministers from ITU's 23 member countries, whose mission is to foster innovation and entrepreneurship for a more inclusive digital future.
- ◆ The Indian Banks Association has elected Central Bank of India Managing Director and Chief Executive Officer MV Rao as its new president. This decision was taken in the meeting of the nominated administrative committee.




