History of December 20

- ♦ 1876: The great poet Bankim Chandra Chattopadhyay composed the national song Vande Mataram.
- ◆ 1993 : A cooperation agreement was signed between India and the European Union in Brussels.
- 1988: Parliament approved the bill to reduce the voting age from 21 to 18 years through the 62nd Constitutional Amendment.
- ◆ 1946 : Mahatma Gandhi stayed in Shrirampur for a month.

Current Affairs Related to 20 December

- Taiwan-based giant Foxconn, responsible for assembling around 70% of iPhones globally, will invest an additional Rs 139.11 billion in the state of Karnataka. The decision highlights Foxconn's ongoing efforts to diversify production away from China, driven by disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and geopolitical tensions. Foxconn, the world's largest contract manufacturing company, has been expanding rapidly in India in the last one year.
- The Reserve Bank of India has authorized city-based Bandhan Bank to pay pension to retired railway employees. According to a statement issued by private lender Bandhan Bank, the bank will soon integrate its system with the Railway Ministry to handle the pension disbursement process. This approval from RBI will provide the bank access to approximately 50,000 retirees every year in 17 regional offices and eight production units of Railways across the country. This will help pensioners get access to competitive rates offered by the bank and other products of the lender.
- Since the launch of Jal Jeevan Mission, about 71.51% of the 19.24 crore rural families in the country now have the facility of tap water at home. The Government of India, steadfast in its commitment to provide safe and potable tap water to every rural household in the country, launched the Jal Jeevan Mission in August 2019. The mission, implemented in collaboration with the states, aims to ensure provision of water in adequate quantity and prescribed quality on a regular and long-term basis.
- ♦ According to a recent survey by the Reserve Bank of India, Indian banks significantly increased their overseas presence in the financial year 2022-2023, increasing from 399 last year to 417 subsidiaries. The survey covered 14 Indian banks with overseas branches or subsidiaries and 44 foreign banks with presence in India.

- Aam Aadmi Party national convenor Arvind Kejriwal and Punjab CM Bhagwant Mann launched the Mann Sarkar, Tuhade Dwar scheme from Ludhiana. Under this scheme, about 4000 operators have been recruited across the state. Under this scheme, the people of Punjab will get the benefit of 43 types of government services sitting at home.
- ♦ Reliance Industries has formed a strategic partnership with DBS Bank India to set up a financing program targeted at farmers and aggregators. The primary objective of this collaboration is to effectively manage crop residue and utilize it in the production of compressed biogas.
- India's commerce department officials are actively negotiating a free trade agreement with Oman in Muscat, aiming to seal a deal by the end of the month. This development assumes significance as talks between India and the Gulf Cooperation Council have faced hurdles, particularly with Saudi Arabia, delaying progress by more than a year. If successful, Oman will become the second GCC member after the UAE to sign an FTA with India.
- YUVAi-Youth for Advancement and Development with AI, National e-Governance Division, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology, a collaborative initiative of Government of India and Intel India, is all set to take center stage at the upcoming Global Partnership Summit on Artificial Intelligence. Are. This groundbreaking program, designed to provide youth with essential AI skills, is gaining recognition for its innovative approach and commitment to building a future-ready workforce.
- According to a new United Nations report, Myanmar will emerge as the world's largest source of opium by overtaking Afghanistan in 2023. This change is attributed to a third consecutive year of increased cultivation due to Myanmar's civil war and a significant decline in opium cultivation in Afghanistan.
