History of January 6

- ◆ **1838** : For the first time, Alfred Well and Samuel Morse successfully demonstrated the electric telegraph to the world. Which proved to be the basis of telecommunication in the future.
- ◆ **1899** : Both the culprits of Indira Gandhi's assassination were hanged.
- ◆ **1929** : Mother Teresa came to Kolkata to serve the sick and poor people in India.
- ◆ **1947** : The All India Congress Committee accepted the partition of India.

Current Affairs Related to 6 January

- ◆ In a significant step towards enhancing infrastructure in Ladakh, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari announced that the government has approved Rs 1170.16 crore for 29 road projects in the region. The development aims to address the connectivity challenges faced by Ladakh, the largest Union Territory in terms of area and the second least populous in the country. The primary objective of these initiatives is to improve connectivity to remote villages of Ladakh.
- ◆ The government is actively engaged in discussions with both domestic and international stakeholders to formulate a policy aimed at increasing local manufacturing of electric vehicles. A senior government official highlighted the ongoing talks with various countries, including Italy and Korea, and stressed the inclusiveness of the policy for both domestic and foreign carmakers.
- ◆ Allahabad High Court ruled that a survey will be conducted for Teen Gundarwali Masjid Shahi Eidgah in Mathura. They are demanding the appointment of a commission to inspect the Shahi Idgah Mosque located near the Krishna Janmabhoomi temple in Mathura.
- ◆ Researchers at Linköping University in Sweden have developed electronic soil that can accelerate plant growth in hydroponic spaces. Electronic soil is a new conductive agricultural substrate specially designed for hydroponic systems.
- ◆ The Administrative Council chaired by Lieutenant Governor Manoh Sinha approved significant changes to the Jammu and Kashmir Panchayati Raj Act, 1989. The amendments focus on including the definition of Other Backward Classes in grassroots level democratic institutions within the Act to facilitate their reservation.
- ◆ The Reserve Bank of India has approved ICICI Prudential Asset Management Company Limited to acquire up to 9.95% stake in Federal Banks.
- ◆ In a strategic move to increase the reach of foreign exchange services, the Reserve Bank of India is set to introduce an unprecedented category of money changers, known as Foreign Exchange Correspondents. This innovative approach is designed to streamline foreign exchange transactions and promote greater ease for users. FXC will operate under a lead agency model, partnering with Category-I and Category-III authorized dealers without the need for separate authorization from RBI.
- ◆ Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank is set to lead a Rs 2500 crore fundraising round for the Mahindra Group-backed Sustainable Energy Infrastructure Investment Trust. According to sources familiar with the matter, various domestic institutional investors will also actively participate in this initiative.
- ◆ In a significant development aimed at boosting tourism and infrastructure in the state of Uttar Pradesh, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath inaugurated the state's first intra-district helicopter service in Bateshwar, a historic village located 65 km from Agra city. This venture, running on public-private partnership model, is expected to open new doors for tourism in the region.
- ◆ Famous Indian cricketer Ambati Rayudu joined YSR Congress. Rayudu joined the party in the office of the Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh. By including Ambati Rayudu in the party, YSR Congress is considering it a decision to bring the youth of the state into its fold before the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.
- ◆ The Ministry of Road Transport and Highways presented a document in Parliament, according to which Kerala has the highest financial burden followed by Haryana and Uttar Pradesh. The reason for this is the norms like the state bearing 25% of the land acquisition cost for national highway development.

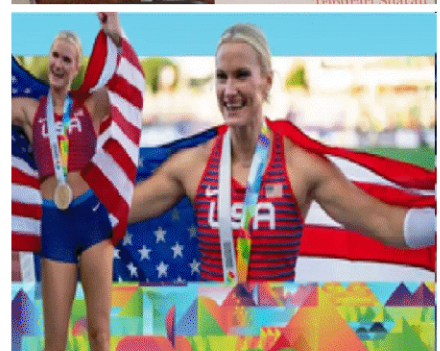

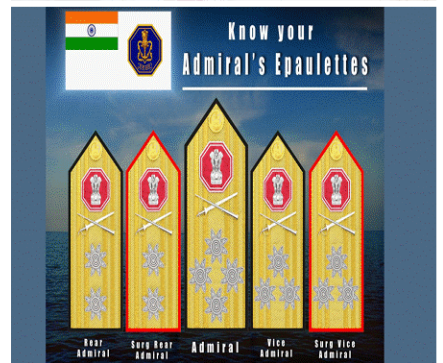
