History of 4th March

- 1999: UN employees announced the survival of their children.

ward Frederick Lindley Wood and Mahondas Karamchand Gandhi announced consultation and agreement regarding the release of the Great Political Rejection and the exemption of universal use of salt.

Current Affairs Related to 4th March

- Central Electricity Authority Ministry of Power is organizing the 4th edition of Lineman's Day on 4th March 2024 in New Delhi. On this day, the important work and service of linemen and ground maintenance employees is being celebrated for the related details. Which play the most important role in the work of electricity distribution across the country. The theme of the fourth edition of the festival, organized in collaboration with Tata Power Delhi Distribution Limited, is Service, Safety, Room, which celebrates the selfless service of linemen across the country.
- January 2024 saw growth in the production of coal, steel, cement, electricity, natural gas and crude oil. The growth rate of steel sector declined from 14.3% in January 2023 to 7% in January 2024. Similarly, the growth rate of power sector decreased from 12.7% in January 2023 to 5.2% in January 2024.
- King Charles III of the United Kingdom has honored Sunil Bharti Mital with an honorary knighthood. Sunil Bharti Mital has become the first Indian citizen to receive this award. As a result of the award Mr Mittal has received the title of Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire. The award recognizes his achievements in developing closer trade relations between India and the UK. Honorary knighthood is the highest honor bestowed upon a citizen by the British Crown.
- Scientists from the Zoological Survey of India have discovered a new species of head-shield sea slug from the Bay of Bengal. This new species, discovered from Udaipur and Digha coast of Odisha and West Bengal, has been named Melanochlamys draupadi. This species is a small invertebrate, reaching a maximum length of 7 mm. It is brownish black in color with a ruby red spot at its rear end. Presently the spread of this species has been recorded within a radius of 3 kilometers of Digha Udaipur coast.

- Finance Secretary TV Somanathan will lead the committee on Uniform Know Your Customer. The committee will include members from various ministries and regulators. The Financial Stability and Development Council had decided to formulate a strategy to digitize and simplify the KYC process in the financial sector. He said this would be simplified through a risk-based approach rather than a one-size-fits-all approach.
- A joint venture agreement has been signed between NTPC Green Energy, a wholly owned subsidiary of NTPC, and Maharashtra State Power Generation Company. It has been signed for the development of renewable energy parks in the state of Maharashtra. The company to be set up under the joint venture will develop GW scale renewable energy parks and launch projects of this scale in a phased manner. This agreement is in line with NTPC's green energy objectives and is another step in the Government of India's efforts towards the energy transition.
- The number of leopards has increased by more than 1000 in the last four years. Status report of leopards in India has been released by Union Environment Minister Bhupendra Yadav. The number of leopards in the country has now reached 13874, in 2018 it was 12852. The highest population of leopards has been recorded in Madhya Pradesh.
- PM Modi and Prime Minister of Mauritius jointly inaugurated developmental projects in Agaliga Island, Mauritius. The projects inaugurated include the new airstrip and St. James Jetty along with six community development projects. These facilities will boost the socio-economic development of Agalega Island. India has undertaken several infrastructure projects, such as the construction of a sports council, a metro line, social housing, a community development project, an ENT hospital and a civil services college.


