#### **History of 8th May**

- ♦ 1933 : Mahatma Gandhi fasted for 21 days against British rule.
- ◆ 1980 : The World Health Organization made an announcement regarding smallpox.

- ◆ 1954: The central government included Chandernagore in the state of West Bengal.

#### **Current Affairs Related to 8th May 2024**

- Forest officials' study said that removing exotic plant species from forests would ensure food for wild animals. A study by the Kerala State Forest Conservation Employees Organization says removal of exotic plants from forest areas will help ensure food for jungle elephants in Munnar's Chinnakkanal. He interacted with the local people and panchayat officials about the steps to reduce human elephant conflict in the area.
- ♦ According to the latest Economic Outlook report of ICD, it is expected that India's GDP will grow by 7.8% in the financial year 2023-2024. It has estimated a growth of 6.6% in the next two financial years. According to the report, gross capital formation, especially in the public sector, will boost India's domestic demand. Private consumption growth is expected to remain sluggish. Exports will continue to increase. Services such as information technology and consulting will see growth in global market share.
- The 11th Joint Trade Committee meeting was held by India and New Zealand to strengthen trade relations. The Indian delegation, led by Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal, had fruitful discussions with key stakeholders including New Zealand Trade Minister Todd McLay and Acting Chief Executive Brooke Barrington. The meeting between the two countries highlighted the immense potential for cooperation especially in sectors like pharmaceuticals, agriculture and food processing.
- According to the new update of RBI, 97.76 percent of the Rs 2000 notes in circulation have returned to the banking system. Of the withdrawn notes, only Rs 7961 crore worth notes are still with the public. According to RBI, the total value of Rs 2000 bank notes in circulation has declined from Rs 3.6 lakh crore on May 19, 2023 to only Rs 7961 crore by April 30, 2024.

- As per the order of FSSAI, comprehensive testing of spices of all brands will be done. FSSAI has directed its officials to conduct thorough inspection, sampling and testing in all spice manufacturing facilities. It has also directed state governments to conduct spice testing to guarantee quality. This decision has been taken after Singapore and Hong Kong stopped the sale of some spices from MDH and Everest.
- The Patent Office of the Government of India has granted a patent on an indigenously developed lightweight, compact and easy-to-carry inverter to the Indian Institute of Technology, Patna. This patented technology will go a long way in making the country self-reliant in the field of portable power modules. IIT P will have the copyright to commercially use this technology for 20 years.
- The Department of Pension and Pensioners' Welfare has launched an integrated pensioner portal of Bank of India, also known as Bhavishya Portal. It combines the pension processing and payment services of five banks into a single window. Retirees can check their monthly pension slips, check life certificate status, submit Form 16 and view details of dues paid through this portal.
- The oldest evidence of rocks in the Earth's magnetic field have been found in Greenland. These rocks have been discovered by geologists from MIT and Oxford University. Researchers found that the age of the rocks is about 3.7 billion years. The minimum strength of his magnetic field was 15 microtesla. Previous research has provided evidence that Earth's magnetic field is at least 3.5 billion years old




- 1. When is World Thalassemia Day celebrated every year?
