In a sports event, six teams (A, B, C, D, E and F) are competing against each other Matches are scheduled in two stages. Each team plays three matches in State – I and two matches in Stage – II. No team plays against the same team more than once in the event. No ties are permitted in any of the matches. The observations after the completion of Stage – I and Stage – II are as given below.

#### Stage-I:

- Once team won all the three matches.
- Two teams lost all the matches.

- D lost to A but won against C and F.
- E lost to B but won against C and F.
- B lost at least one match.
- F did not play against the top team of Stage-I.

#### Stage-II:

- The leader of Stage-I lost the next two matches
- Of the two teams at the bottom after Stage-I, one team won both matches, while the other lost both matches.
- Once more team lost both matches in Stage-II.

Six teams among A, B, C, D, E and F participated in a football tournament where each team played against every other team exactly once. Three points were awarded to the winner of each match whereas for a drawn game one point was awarded to each of the two teams, there being no points for a loss.

At the end of all the games the following observations were made

- No two teams got the same number of points.
- C ended with more points than F.
- The matches between B and C and that between D and F both ended in 1 1 draws.
- In the matches between A and B and that between A and C. 6 and 4 goals respectively were scored.
- In the matches between C and D and that between C and E, 3 and 2 goals respectively were scored.
- In each of the matches played by F. the total number of goals scored was 2 and only one of them was a draw.

**Direction:** A hockey tournament was played involving Australia. Germany, Poland Spain. India and Canada at Hannover, Germany. In the tournament, each team played against every other team exactly once. Each match lasted for 90 minutes and the team that scored more goals than the other team was declared the winner while the team that scored fewer goals than the other team lost the match. If both teams scored equal number of goals, the match was said to be drawn. A team was awarded 2 points for every match won. 1 point for every match drawn and 0 points for every match lost.

At the end of the tournament, the points table was as follows:

- 4. Germany scored 3 goals against Poland and 2 goals against Canada. Both Poland and Canada failed to score a single goal against Germany.
- 5. India failed to score a single goal against Poland and Australia.
- 6. Poland scored 2 goals against Australia and 5 goals against Spain.
- 7. Spain scored 2 goals against India and 3 goals against Canada but failed to score a single goal against Australia.

In the opening match, Spain lost to Germany. After the second round (after each team played two matches), the pool table looked as shown below.
