History of 20th June

- ♦ 712 : Mohammad bin Qasim attacked Rawar in Sindh and killed the Hindu king Dahir.
- ♦ 1756: Nawab Siraj-ud-Daula's soldiers imprisoned the British soldiers in the cellars of Fort William.
- ♦ 1858: Gwalior Fort was captured by British troops and the rebellion was officially ended by the first Indian historians.
- ▶ 1840 : Samuel Morse patented the telegraph.

Current Affairs Related to 20th June 2024

- Lieutenant General Walker Uz Zaman has been appointed the new Army Chief of Bangladesh. He will take charge for three years on June 23. Zaman currently serves as the Chief of General Staff of the Bangladesh Army. He will replace General SM Shafiuddin Ahmed. Walker uz Zaman was commissioned as an Infantry Corps officer in 1985. Zaman will oversee military operations, military intelligence, UN peacekeeping affairs and budget as well as other military-related issues.
- CAMS Insurance Repository Services launches Insurance Central. It will act as a one-stop platform to simplify insurance portfolio management. It will allow users to manage life, health and motor policies through their secure e-insurance account. E-Insurance Account users will get access to Insurance Central to manage their policies with different insurance companies. Currently the interface will be available in English and Hindi on Android, iOS and web portal.
- The International Astronomical Union has approved naming two new craters discovered on Mars after two small towns in the Indian states of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar. The IAU has also officially approved naming another stone after Professor Lal, former director of the Physical Research Laboratory of India. This Trikuta mountain is located in the Tharsis volcanic region on Mars. The largest of these three, Gandha, is 65 kilometers long.
- West Indies left-arm spinner Gudakesh Moti has won the ICC Men's Player of the Month for his stellar performances in several months. Gudakesh Pearl had achieved a lot of success in the three-match home series against South Africa. This left-arm bowler took eight wickets in three matches at an average of 8.50. On the basis of his performance, the host team won Jamaica by 3.0.

- National Crime Records Bureau has launched NCRB Criminal News Compilation, a mobile app which acts as a comprehensive guide providing complete information about new criminal news at one place. The new criminal law will come into effect from the 1st of next month. This app is a compilation of new criminal videos which covers Indian Judicial Code, Indian Civil Defense Code and Indian Evidence Act.
- The National Institute of Indian Medical Heritage in Hyderabad under the Ministry of AYUSH has been designated as a WHO Collaborating Center for Traditional Medicine Research. The National Institute of Indian Medical Heritage in Hyderabad is a unit under the Central Council for Research in Ayurvedic Sciences. This institute will now serve as the WHO center for fundamental and literary research in traditional medicine. This recognition has been given for four years.
- India's merchandise exports increased by 9.1% to \$38.13 billion in May 2024. The goods trade deficit widened to a seven-month high of \$23.78 billion in May. The goods trade deficit in May 2024 was 5.5% more than the deficit in May 2023. The goods trade deficit in May 2024 was 24.5% more than the April trade deficit of \$19.1 billion.
- PK Mishra became the Principal Secretary to PM Modi. Former President PK Mishra has been reappointed as Principal Secretary to Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Dr. PK Mishra, PhD, Chamber of Commerce and Industry, as Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister. His appointment will be coterminous with the tenure of the Prime Minister or until further orders, whichever is earlier.
- ♦ On the final day of the summit in Italy, G-7 leaders discussed issues like migration, artificial intelligence, economic security and the Indo-Pacific region.


