History of December 2

- ♦ 1804 : Napoleon Bonaparte was crowned as Emperor of France.
- ♦ 1999: Private sector investment in the insurance sector in India was approved.

- 1911: George V and Queen Mary became the first King and Queen of Britain to visit India. The Gateway of India was built to commemorate his arrival in Bombay.
- ◆ 1989: Vishwa Pratap Singh became the seventh Prime Minister of the country.

Current Affairs Related to 2 December

- Madhya Pradesh government has issued orders for the construction of Veerangana Durgavati Tiger Reserve. This tiger reserve will be spread over an area of more than 400 kilometers in the border of Damoh, Sagar and Narsinghpur districts. The buffer area of Rani Durgavati Tiger Reserve will be 925 square kilometers. It is said that due to the Ken Betwa Link Project, a large part of Panna National Park is being affected. Therefore, the environmental protection authority had set a condition for creating a new tiger reserve.
- ◆ Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri launched GAIL's floating CNG and mobile re-fuelling unit station at Ravidas Ghat in Varanasi. This CNG station, developed at a cost of about Rs 18 crore, can be shifted from one place to another in the Ganga. With this, boats operating in Ganga will be freed from the problem of having to travel far for CNG. In the new station of Ravidas Ghat, CNG will be filled through cascade from Namo Ghat.
- Chhatrapati Shahuji Maharaj University in Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh has achieved a significant achievement by achieving the highest grading of A++ from the National Assessment and Accreditation Council. This achievement places Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj University among the select state universities of Uttar Pradesh with similar prestigious status. The university's remarkable journey from B grade to toptier A++ ratings in 2006 and 2015 reflects its dedication towards academic excellence and overall institutional development.
- An MoU has been signed between the National Institute of Disaster Management and the Institute of Energy and Resources to create a strategic partnership in disaster risk reduction. This partnership symbolizes our joint commitment to contribute to the national agenda of disaster risk reduction, reinforcing the importance of cooperation in building a resilient and secure India. The MoU will serve as a platform to formalize the strategic partnership and facilitate research, capacity building and training.

- In an important step towards sustainability and reducing dependence on natural gas imports, the Government of India has announced the phased introduction of biogas blending. The initiative aims to boost domestic demand, reduce dependence on natural gas imports and contribute to India's commitment to achieve net zero emissions by 2070. From April 2025, the government will introduce mandatory blending of compressed biogas with natural gas at the rate of 1 per cent.
- The Central Government renamed Ayushman Bharat Health and Wellness Centers as Ayushman Arogya Mandir. By issuing guidelines through the letter, all the states and union territories have been asked to change the existing names appropriately. The ministry has also asked to upload photographs of the primary health centers after completing the name changing work. It is underlined that the National Health Mission logo will be retained in the rebranded centres
- ♦ The central government has added the Computer Emergency Response Team to the list of organizations exempted from the Right to Information Act 2005. 26 other intelligence and security organizations have been exempted under the Right to Information Act 2005. In the previous amendment, Strategic Forces Command was added to the list of organizations exempted under RTI.
- Diplomats from South Korea, Japan and China agreed to resume their trilateral leaders' summit. 25% of global GDP is produced by these three countries. These countries have agreed to restore and normalize cooperation between the three countries as soon as possible. They also agreed to cooperate in various areas such as people-to-people exchanges, trade, technology, public health, sustainable development and security.


4. When is World Computer Literacy Day celebrated every year?


5. Which state has recently got GI tag for cashew?


