Current Affairs Related to 28th March

- India has strengthened its northern border with indigenously developed Integrated Kingdom System Detection and Interdiction. In response to the rising tensions along the border with the Indian Army, China has begun a significant increase in its air defense capabilities. At the center of this institute is the Voice Integrated Diamond Detection and Interaction System developed domestically in collaboration with Defense Research and Development Organization and Bharat Electronics.
- America's lovers have done wonders for the first time in the world by transplanting a kidney of scope in humans. Before transplanting this kidney, American scientists have also determined it as genetics. After this, documentary surgery was done on 62 year old patients. A large team of surgeons in Boston, USA, has announced the creation of a dialogue in one patient by experts. This is being seen as a big revolution in the medical world.
- Surat Diamond Bourse has appointed Samajwadi Party leader from Gujarat Govind Dholakia as its new chairman. This came a day after previous Chairman Vallabhbhai Patel retired from his post. AB Core Committee members discussed the next phase of the meeting after Lakhani's reinstatement. After considering various diamond establishments the committee decided to nominate Dholakia, owner of SRK Diamonds and member of the associate advisory committee, as the new President.
- ♦ ISRO's Chandrayaan 3 mission receives Aviation Week Laureates Award. Deputy Ambassador Sripriya Ranganathan accepted. The awards acknowledge aerospace excellence, innovation and celebrate innovation. Indian Embassy in the US Sripriya Ranganathan accepted the award on behalf of ISRO.
- Noida Bench of Allahabad High Court has declared the UP Board of Madrasa Education Act 2004 as unconstitutional.

- The Saksham app will facilitate easy voting for persons with disabilities. The motto of the Election Commission of India is that no voter should be left out. Voters above 85 years of age and persons with disabilities having 40% benchmark disability can vote from home. Wheelchairs and volunteers will be provided at each polling station.
- The exploration of Gaya led by Mahima Malhan has revealed ancient star simulations of Shiva and Shakti formed 12 billion years ago. Unique classes and creations are unique examples of them. According to the European Space Agency, astronauts have discovered an apogee connecting two ancient streams called Shiva and Shakti.
- Tech Mahindra and IBM have joined hands to inaugurate a Synergy Dock in Singapore, which aims to accelerate digital adoption in the Asia Pacific region. This collaboration seeks to drive innovation and leverage the next generation of technology to provide unique products to various brands. Tech Mahindra and IBM announce Synergy Volco in Singapore. Located on the campus of Tech Mahindra, the lock aims to facilitate next generation devolution between entrants into a PSE.
- The Bureau of Investigation and Europol signed an important working arrangement to enhance cooperation in the investigation of international crime. The Central Bureau of Investigation and Europol have entered into an important working arrangement with the aim of promoting co-operation between crime-related investigations and studies.
- Venezuela is the country with the world's largest proven oil reserves. India became the largest buyer of crude oil from Venezuela in January 2024. This happened after the US lifted the sanctions imposed on Venezuela for six months from October 18, 2023. Reimposition of US sanctions after April 18 may impact trade.
