Current Affairs Related to 5 December

- Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite for comprehensive Earth observations in the first quarter of next year. India and the United States are set to take their space cooperation to new heights with the upcoming joint launch of NASA ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar satellite. Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh announced the launch schedule for the first quarter of next year in a meeting with a high-level NASA delegation led by Administrator Shri Bill Nelson.
- ♦ Vaccine major Bharat Biotech International Limited has partnered with the University of Sydney's Institute of Infectious Diseases to advance vaccine research initiatives, strengthen academic-industry partnerships and enhance global efforts to combat infectious diseases. Its objective is to establish strong regional and inter-organizational cooperation to develop new methods to deal with any future pandemics and infectious diseases.
- ↑ Tata Autocomp Systems has sold 13.26 acre Pune land parcel with 1,00,000 sq ft structure to Titania Industrial Development for Rs 134 crore. The transaction, worth Rs 134 crore, included the sale of both land and a structure measuring 1,000,000 sq ft in the complex.
- ◆ Defense Minister Rajnath Singh unveiled the crest of the Indian Navy's INS Imphal. The stealth guided missile destroyer Imphal is equipped with Brahos surface-to-surface missiles and indigenous anti-submarine rocket launchers. The design of the crest depicts Kangla Palace on the left and Kangla-Sa on the right.
- ◆ The 600th gamma-ray burst has been detected by India's Astrosat's CZTI detector. The full name of CZTI here is Cadmium Zinc Telluride Imager, which reflects the continued performance of CZTI eight years after the launch of Astrosat.

- Military Literature Festival, an event aimed at spreading awareness about the vital role of the armed forces and inspiring the youth, is set to return for its second district level edition in Amritsar. The decision to host the festival at the district level reflects the commitment of the Punjab State Government. It aims to create greater awareness about the armed forces and inspire the youth to foster a deeper understanding of their role in national security.
- The Central Government announced the schedule of the second phase of Kasi Tamil Sangamam. IIT Madras has launched the registration portal for the programme. The event will see around 1400 people from Tamil Nadu and Puducherry travel to Varanasi, Prayagraj and Ayodhya for an eight-day tour. Its main objective is to share the knowledge and cultural traditions of North and South. Also, relations between the two regions have to be further strengthened.
- HDFC Securities, India's leading investment services provider, has successfully launched its mobile training app, HDFC Sky, on Amazon Web Services Cloud. The partnership with AWS is expected to deliver substantial benefits, including a significant 50% reduction in annual IT infrastructure and management costs compared to traditional on-premises solutions.
- Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar urged countries in the Global South to follow India's example and review colonial laws.
